Ms. Victoria Harrison began to study Bowen theory in 1976 at Georgetown Family Center where Murray Bowen and faculty inspired research in the biology of reactivity and relationships. She used the biofeedback program established by Lilian Rosenbaum, literature in evolution and natural sciences, and relationship with scientists to study health and reproduction. Ms. Harrison maintains clinical practice in Houston, Texas where she also directs the Center for the Study of Natural Systems and the Family.

She commutes to DC where she has served on The Bowen Center faculty since 1992 . She is currently working to publish findings from Observations of Change and from Physiology and Family research. She teaches at a variety of conferences where she uses the invitation to move this work forward.
